The Dugout Pals



From the Pitching Mound


The play starts with the pitcher. Here are a few things to remember when pitching.

- Release the ball once it brushes past leg
- Make sure the hip movement follows along with the dropping of the arm.
- Shoulders should stay back overtop of hips

























Help Ellie catch the ball.

She wants to make the right play by throwing it to second base.




Ellie is an excellent drawer as well as catcher.

Softball Skills 101


Softball is a team sport. Your teammates depend on you to do your best, just as much as you depend on them to try their hardest.
